Also, our annual Christmas potluck meal is planned.

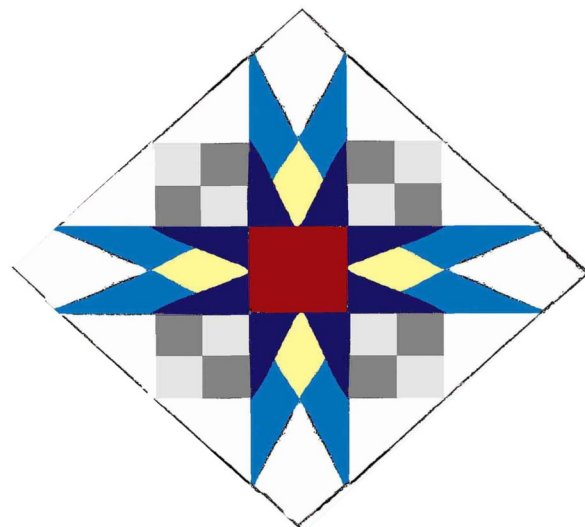
We will not do the fat quarter exchange this month.

The Quilt Guild met November 3, 2025, at the Extension Office. Mary Lowery, President, called the meeting to order at 5:40 p.m. Peggy F read an inspiration on positive thoughts. Peggy gave the Treasurer's report. The bank balance is \$1,364.13. She has been unable to deliver the Backpack Buddies donation and will take the check to the School Board office. Betty Ann made the motion, seconded by Peggy to approve the October minutes published in the Newsletter. Motion approved.

The Junior Homemaker start up meeting will be held November 20 at 3:30 p.m. Forty-seven young people from ages 13 to 18 have said they are interested in this group. They will learn skills for subjects such as quilting, cooking, sewing.

Quilts for Cops are requested by January. Fleece blankets may also be donated. Walmart has one sized 50"x 60".

The Quilt Retreat will be March 27 and 28, 2026. The Retreat committee is Peggy, Joan and Betty Jo.

Peggianna, Betty Ann and Betty Jo showed the Block of the Month. Mary explained the Meeting Room policy adopted by the Executive Board. Any sign up for the use of the meeting Room is to be made on the website.

Mary suggested we participate in the Christmas Parade, walking or riding. She will drive her husband's truck. December 6 at 5:00 p.m. The theme is Kentucky Christmas.

Mary reminded members to keep track of volunteer hours and read books. Kay S is selling leftover Bazaar items. The Bazaar made over \$800.

November birthdays are Darlene, Theresa Mahl and Pat Miller. Peggianna, Betty Ann and Roetta have made 45 prayer quilts for QDO. 100 crosses at Amazon costs \$7.99. The winners of the Fat Quarter game were Judy, Connie and Betty Ann.

A program was presented on applique by Darlene and Betty Jo. Darlene taught her applique technique. She turns under the edge and bastes before stitching the applique piece. She showed an applique quilt made by her Mother, who passed away 50 years ago, and an applique quilt she had made. Betty Jo showed unfinished cardinals applique blocks begun by her mother-in-law. She also showed a Dresden plate quilt which uses interfacing and taught her by Linda Marean. Beth showed her applique double wedding ring quilt. The pattern is by Quilt Smart.

Peggy F brought five flannel quilts she has made for Quilts for Cops.

Door prizes were drawn for Joan, Beth and Kay McDaniel.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:05 p.m.
