The Treasurers' have paperwork to do and a process to complete before sending in the dues. Dues are due to the KEHA state Treasurer around 1 December (cant' remember).

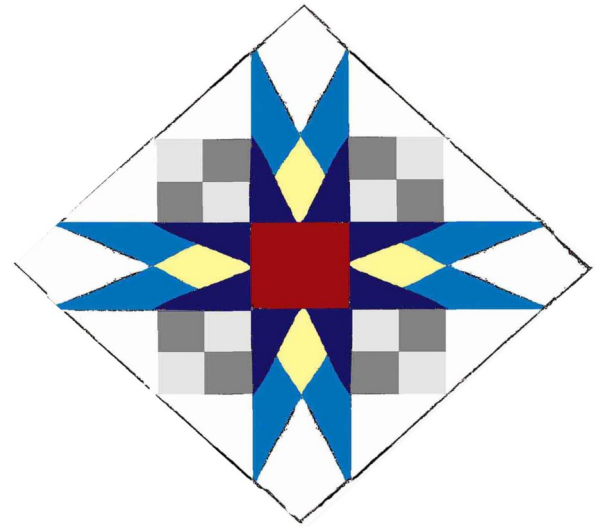

ANDERSON COUNTY PIECEMAKERS QUILT GUILD MINUTES

The Quilt Guild met on October 6, 2025 at the Extension Office. Mary Lowery, President called the meeting to order at 5:40 p.m. Twenty people were present. Peggy Franklin read the inspiration. Peggy then gave the Treasurer's report of \$1,688.13. Cheri made the motion, seconded by Betty Ann, to adopt the September minutes as published in the newsletter. Motion carried.

Mary reminded members that quilt guild dues of \$13 are due. County dues are \$12. Kay S. passed around the Membership List so members may verify their information and get current email information for newsletters.

October birthdays are Judy, Betty Ann, and Betty Jo, who each received a fat quarter.

Mary reviewed upcoming events listed on the Agenda, including our annual Bazaar on October 18 which will include baked goods. Each club provides a give-away basket. The Guild basket is a baking collection. In November, we will form a committee to plan for the Quilt Retreat on March 27 and 28, 2026.

The third block of the month was shown by Peggianna, Betty Ann, Garnetta, Betty Jo and Cheri.

Winners of the Left/Right/Center fat quarter game were Connie, Judy, June and Betty Jo.

Mary asked members to help replenish the quilt and pillowcase supply for the City and County police who provide them to children in crisis situations. She suggested fleece blankets of about 50"x60" if unable to provide a quilt.

She asked the items be available by the January meeting.

In honor of Homemaker month the Fiscal Court and County Judge/Executive are signing a proclamation recognizing Anderson County Homemakers. Peggy read the totals of volunteer hours donated by our homemakers this past year.

The October Second Saturday Sew group will make a Prairie Point pillow.

Garnetta gave the fabric supplies needed. The Fourth Saturday Quilt Bee is making blocks in the Underground Railroad pattern. Garnetta said the second Saturday November group will make a patchwork skirt. There is sewing on Block of the Month on Thursday after a quilt guild meeting, taught by Garnetta.

The annual Christmas Stocking event will be held at the December Guild meeting. Quilters bring a stocking made of their own design. Stockings are displayed and voted on with change. This money along with the monthly Coins collection and the budget amount are used to fill the stockings. The Senior Center delivers the stockings to home-bound seniors. Mary will form a committee in November to shop for items to fill the stockings.

Joan made a motion for our Guild to provide goody bag items for the Quilters Day Out in March 2026. Garnetta seconded. Motion carried.

Cheri presented the program. She passed out a handout and showed how to make small prayer quilts. Members agreed to make these for the QDO goody bags. She has copies of the printed verse. Each person is asked to make 15. There is a crocheted version. Joan and Cheri are the committee, Garnetta will consult.

Members presented Show and Tell. Meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.
