See you Wednesday, September 3rd!

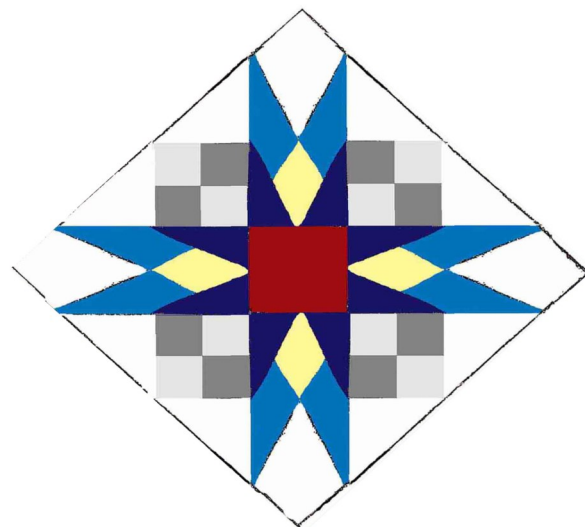

The Quilt Guild meeting was August 4, 2025 at 5:30 pm at the Extension Office. Twenty-three attended, 19 members, and 4 guests. Guests are Audrey Fint, Peggy Franklin's guest; Patti Wilson, Judy Howard's sister; Shelby Scott and Wendy Anderson.

Mary called the meeting to order. Peggy Franklin read an inspiration on Happiness. Peggy gave the Treasurer's report of \$1473.63.

### Old Business:

Cheri made the motion to approve the July minutes as published in the Newsletter, seconded by Judy. All in favor. Motion carried. Mary reviewed upcoming events as shown on the agenda. The Homemaker Bazaar in October 18.

Cheri reminded members to report volunteer hours monthly for easier reporting.

### New Business:

Quilt Guild dues are due now. \$13 for the Quilt Guild. Peggy collected County homemaker registration forms from members.

There is a quilt display in the Franklin County Library of Quilts of Valor. Show and Tell was presented.

Peggianna, Betty Ann and Roetta presented the program. They demonstrated how to make a 6-inch square pincushion. The top has a center square with strips sewed around. The backing is sewed on and it is filled with crushed walnut shells from the pet store. Shelby Scott and Patti Wilson received door prizes.

The September 3rd meeting is on Wednesday after Labor Day. Kay McDaniel and Beth Brundage will present the program and door prizes.
