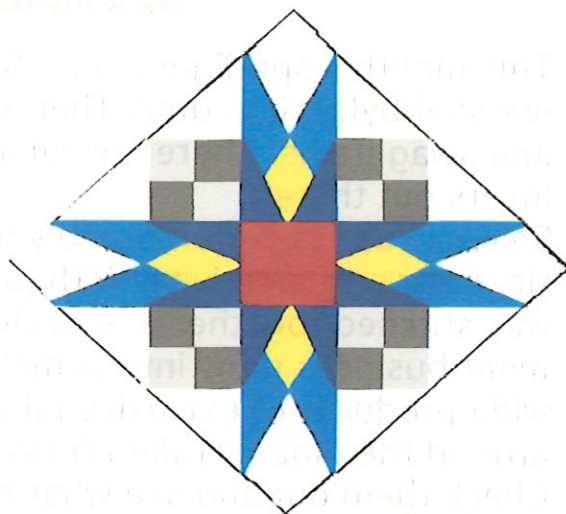
Three Fat Quarters Game

These rulers are made by Creative Grids. He answered questions about the cost of the ruler, left hand/right hand rotary cutters and classes at the shop.
